

Minutes from Port/Dock Captain's meeting Tues, 9-13-16

Presentation-Seattle Fire Dept, Marine Div:

- They have 2 engines, 2 fireboats (one inside the locks and one on the waterfront), 2 large rescue boats, and 2 small rescue boats, CO2 hoses and environmentally-friendly foam. Their main responses have been for large commercial vessels, but they would respond to recreational boat fires. They were very insistent upon:
 - If there is a fire on a boat, DO NOT cut the boat loose. It can drift to another dock and catch other boats on fire.
 - You can remove your boat or neighbor's boats that are threatened –but do so *under control*. If they are cut loose, they block the waterway for the fire boats trying to get here
 - DO have the contact person for the vessel available on site for the fire dept to communicate with
 - Be familiar with your fire fighting equipment on your boat and it's locations on the dock.
 - The fire dept will use lots of foam (which is non-toxic) so to reduce the volume of water used
 - Fiberglass burns like solid gasoline with extreme heat and the smoke is very toxic
 - Call 911 and ask for FIRE

Marina Updates: Tracy McKendry, Sr. Mngr, Rec Boating

- New LED lights and fixtures are being installed
- The new Bocce Ball court on the southside of the office still needs some painting but is open for marina tenants. Equipment can be checked out at the office.
- Curb cuts will be done on J, K, L, M, N, O dock entrances
- New HAZ-MAT container will be installed in a more central area of the marina as soon as the permit comes in
- A-Dock ramp to be repaired
- Proposed budget items:
 - A marina wide safety PA system for emergencies
 - Dock cart corrals to be built throughout the parking lot
 - 20-30 new dock carts per year
 - Dock pressure washing will continue...5-7 docks per year
 - Installation of electrical vehicle charging station
 - Extra garbage compactors
 - More safety ladders on docks
